Faculty members in the College of Business have approved the following curriculum change:

Deactivate the Minor in International Business, effective spring 2012. We will no longer be accepting students into the minor beginning January 2012.

Rationale: Few students are graduating with the minor. Between the fall 2005 and fall 2009 only three students graduated with the International Business minor even though enrollment averaged 22 per semester during that same time period. One of the courses in the minor (BCOM 4282) is not being taught; another course (MGMT 4145) is at or above capacity. After using the existing CoB international business courses for the minor, there are only two IB electives available to fill the last course slot in the minor; one of those courses has prerequisites. In addition, the university offers several other outlets for this competency, including the International Certificate, which requires 12 hours of international courses, foreign language competency, a semester-long study abroad, and a capstone project.
