ECUS MOTION Proposing Revisions to University Senate Bylaws

CURRENT BYLAW

V.Section2.D.1.a. <u>Membership</u>. The Subcommittee on the Core Curriculum shall have no fewer than eleven (11) but no more than sixteen (16) members distributed as follows: the University Registrar who shall be an ex officio non-voting member; one (1) member of the University Assessment Team appointed by a process determined by the University Assessment Team who shall be a non-voting member; at least one (1) teaching representative from each area of the core (A1, A2, B, C1, C2, D1 (science), D3 (technology), and E); at least one (1) member representing each academic unit (college, library); and one (1) member who is the Chief Academic Officer or an individual appointed by the Chief Academic Officer to serve as her/his designee. A teaching representative is defined as a full-time member of the Corps of Instruction who has taught at least one (1) course in the represented area in the two (2) calendars years preceding the date of appointment to the subcommittee. At least three (3) voting members of the subcommittee shall be elected faculty senators and all voting members must be selected from the Corps of Instruction faculty.

PROPOSED REVISION

V.Section2.D.1.a. <u>Membership</u>. The Subcommittee on the Core Curriculum shall have no fewer than eleven (11) but no more than sixteen (16) members distributed as follows: the University Registrar who shall be an ex officio non-voting member; one (1) member of the University Assessment Team appointed by a process determined by the University Assessment Team who shall be a non-voting member; at least one (1) teaching representative from each area of the core (A1, A2, B, C1, C2, D1 (science), D3 (technology), and E); at least one (1) member representing each academic unit (college, library); and one (1) member who is the Chief Academic Officer or an individual appointed by the Chief Academic Officer to serve as her/his designee. A teaching representative is defined as a full-time member of the Corps of Instruction who has taught at least one (1) course in the represented area in the two (2) calendars years preceding the date of appointment to the subcommittee. At least two (2) voting members of the subcommittee shall be elected faculty senators and all voting members must be selected from the Corps of Instruction faculty.

RATIONALE for proposed revision

In recent years, at least one elected faculty senator had to serve on two standing committees in order to meet committee composition requirements. Decreasing the required number of elected faculty senators on SoCC by one will make available an additional EFS to address this issue.

It is worth noting that the proposed revision is in compliance with Bylaw V.Section2.A.3.a. Permanent Subcommittees, which states that at least two (2) members on permanent subcommittees shall be university senators.
